Help with Attendance

As you may know one of the judgements made about the effectiveness of a school is the attendance of its pupils. At Holy Trinity we have prided ourselves by being consistently better than the National Average of 96% and our persistent absentee average (those children with less than 90% attendance) is usually significantly below 10%. However this year we are only slightly above the 96% for all pupils and our persistent absentee rate for the first time has remained above 10%. Through our analysis the main reason for this is term time holidays and whilst we absolutely do appreciate that there are legitimate reasons why term time holidays are taken they are having a negative impact on children's education. To highlight the point, a child with 90% attendance will have missed nearly 100 lessons in a school year.
