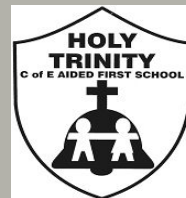

Class 4

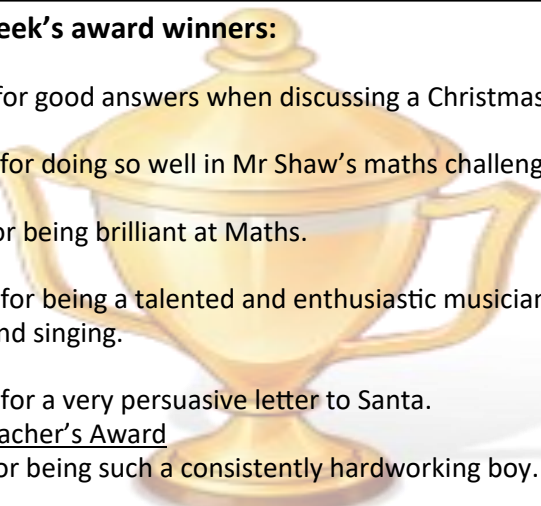
Connie for being a talented and enthusiastic musician in both violin and singing.
