

## COVID-19 Update - Staff Lateral Flow Testing

Next week staff at school have been offered the option of home testing for C19 using Lateral Flow Devices. Testing gives an almost immediate result and is hoped will help to pick up more asymptomatic cases in our community. The knock on effect however, is that we may need to close bubbles with little notice and our families need to be prepared to self-isolate. Please be safe at all times, the rates in our area are the highest they have ever been and many schools have been impacted.

**Class 1** - have been learning about nocturnal animals.


**Class 2** - compared vertebrates and invertebrates.

## Numbers of Children in School

We are concerned about the growing numbers of children in school who are requesting places in our key worker provision. To put it in context we had around 9% of the school population in our key worker group in the first lockdown, this time we have 30%. The new variant of C19 has greatly increased the risk in schools owing to increased transmissibility and the fact that children are more susceptible. Current cases in the town are also the highest they have ever been this week. Although we do understand that more places of work are open during this lockdown the DfE advice to schools is that, **'every child who can be safely educated at home should be,'** and **'schools should only open for children who absolutely need to attend.'**


